

Equipment Safety Talk

1. Introduction (1-2 minutes)

Why It Matters:

Welcome everyone! Today's safety talk focuses on **Equipment Safety.** Whether it's a drill press, mail packager, lawnmower, saw or CNC machine - using **equipment incorrectly or unsafely is a leading cause of workplace injuries**. From crushed fingers to severe lacerations or even fatalities, most incidents are caused by **improper use, lack of training, or skipped inspections**.

The good news? Most equipment-related accidents are 100% preventable.

2. Key Safety Points (3-5 minutes)

Common Equipment Hazards

- Untrained or unauthorized use
- Faulty or uninspected equipment
- Missing guards or safety devices
- Loose clothing or PPE caught in moving parts
- Distractions or rushing
- Improper lifting or positioning
- Poor maintenance or ignoring warning signs

Safe Equipment Use Tips

- Only Use Equipment You're Trained To Use
 - o Don't use any tool or machine unless you've been trained and authorized
 - If you're unsure ask a supervisor
- Inspect Before You Use
 - Check for damage, missing parts, loose bolts, worn cords or blades
 - Don't assume the last person left it in safe condition
 - Tag out and report any defective equipment immediately
- Follow the Manufacturer's Instructions



- Read the equipment manual
- Know how to start, stop, and safely operate the equipment
- o Follow load limits, operating speeds, and usage guidelines

Wear Proper PPE

- Safety glasses, gloves, hearing protection, hard hats, steel-toe boots whatever the task requires
- Avoid loose clothing, jewelry, or anything that can get caught

Use Guards and Safety Features

- Never bypass, remove, or disable safety guards or shutoff switches
- They exist to protect you, not to slow you down

Clean and Store Equipment Safely

- Turn off and unplug before cleaning or servicing
- Store tools and machines in their designated place after use
- Don't leave equipment in walkways or unprotected areas

3. Demonstration & Checklist (3-5 minutes)

- Interactive Segment: Invite questions and clarify any concerns.
 - What's a piece of equipment you've seen used unsafely before?
 - Do you know the procedure if a machine is damaged or not working properly?
 - When was the last time you inspected your tools before using them?
- **Demonstration** Show the group how to use a piece of equipment safely as instructed by the manufacturer.

4. Conclusion (2 minute)

- **Summary**: Every piece of equipment is safe or dangerous depending on how you use it. Equipment doesn't make decisions. **You do.**
- Call to Action: Take the time to do it right. Your hands, eyes, and life depend on it.
- When to Call Emergency Services:
 - Call 911 or local emergency services if the injury is life-threatening, or if you're unsure about the severity.
- Report Accidents:



- Always report any workplace injury, no matter how minor it seems, to your supervisor or EHS office for documentation and follow-up.
- o Ensure the injured person receives proper medical attention.
