

# First Aid Safety Talk

# 1. Introduction (1-2 minutes)

#### Why It Matters:

Welcome everyone! Today's safety talk focuses on **First Aid** – a critical skill that can save lives in the event of an accident or emergency. Whether it's a minor cut, a burn, or something more serious like a heart attack, knowing how to respond properly can make a huge difference.

# 2. Key Safety Points (3-5 minutes)

#### Stay Calm and Assess the Situation

- **Do not panic**: Remaining calm is essential so you can think clearly and act quickly.
- Check for immediate dangers: Before rushing to help, ensure that the area is safe for both the injured person and yourself. Look out for electrical hazards, fire, or unstable objects.

### Assess the Injury

- **Is the person conscious?**: Ask them if they are okay. A simple "Are you alright?" can help you gauge their level of consciousness.
- Look for visible injuries: Check if there's any obvious bleeding, broken bones, or other injuries.
- Pain level: Ask the injured person where it hurts and how much pain they're in.

#### Follow the ABCs of First Aid

- A Airway: Ensure the person's airway is clear. If they're unconscious, gently tilt their head back and lift their chin to open the airway.
- **B Breathing**: Check if they're breathing. Look, listen, and feel for breaths. If they're not breathing, call for emergency assistance or start CPR if trained.
- **C Circulation**: Check for signs of circulation by looking for movement or feeling for a pulse.



## 3. Demonstration & Checklist (3-5 minutes)

- Interactive Segment: Invite questions and clarify any concerns.
  - Ask if anyone has had to use first aid before and encourage sharing of experiences or tips.
  - Explain where the first aid kit is located.
  - Open a first aid kit and demonstrate how to conduct a safety check for required items.
- Basic Items to have in every workplace first aid kit:
  - o (1) Basic First Aid Guide
  - (1) 40" Triangle Bandage w/Safety Pins
  - o (10) Sting Free Antiseptic Wound Wipes
  - o (1) 1/2" x 2.5 yds Adhesive Tape
  - o (4) 3" x 3" Individually Wrapped Sterile Gauze Pads
  - o (2) Pair Non-latex Exam Gloves
  - o (10) Triple Antibiotic Ointment, .5 gram packets
  - (12) Hydrogel Burn Gel, 1/8th oz packets
  - o (1) 4" x 4" Sterile Hydrogel Burn Dressing
  - o (50) 1" x 3" Sheer Strip Adhesive Bandages
  - o (2) 5" x 9" Sterile ABD Pads
  - o (1) 2" x 4.1 yds Rolled Gauze Bandage
  - (2) Pair Sterile Oval Eye Pads w/Adhesive Strips
  - o (1) Sterile Eye Wash w/Screw Cap, 1 oz. bottle
  - o (1) Kit Scissors
  - o (1) Instant Ice Pack, Small
  - o (10) Hand Sanitizer, 1/8th oz. packets
  - o (1) CPR Face Shield
  - o (1) Foil Blanket
  - o (1) ANSI Z308.1-2021 Class A Kit Label
