Fire Prevention, Emergency Exits,	Yes	No	N/A	Comment
Emergency Response				
Stage fire curtains are present and in				
good, working condition.				
Fire doors are unlocked and kept				
closed at all times. Fire doors are not				
to be chocked open or held open in				
any way.				
Emergency exit doors are visible and				
free of obstructions on both sides of				
the doors.				
Exits are properly marked and				
illuminated.				
Fire extinguishers are mounted,				
accessible, and have been inspected				
within the last month.				
AEDs are mounted, accessible, and				
free of obstructions. AEDs have been				
inspected within the last 12 months.				
Props, sets, materials, etc are properly				
stored away from heat sources like				
stage lighting and pyrotechnic effects.				
Performers are trained in safe use of				
special effects (i.e. pyro, fog, smoke,				
etc)				
Special effects are properly mounted,				
secured, and free of obstructions.

no exposed internal wires or taped

Extension cords are only used				
temporarily.				
Electrical panels are free of				
obstructions have a clearance of 30" to				
each side and a clearance of 36" in				
front.

Lighting is properly mounted and				
secured to surfaces.
