Emergency phone numbers, such as				
campus police, are posted near a				
phone.				
Fire doors are unlocked and kept				
closed at all times. Fire doors are not				
to be chocked open or held open in				
any way.				
Emergency exit doors are visible and				
free of obstructions on both sides of				
the doors.				
Exits are properly marked and				
illuminated.				
Fire extinguishers are mounted,				
accessible, and have been inspected				
within the last month.				
Intercom or emergency				
communication equipment is				
operational.				
Occupancy limits and evacuation maps				
are posted near the main theater				
entrances.				
AEDs are mounted, accessible, and				
free of obstructions. AEDs have been				
inspected within the last 12 months.
