tension grids and catwalks.				
Personnel using the grid or catwalk				
systems are wearing proper fall				
protection PPE.				
Personnel using the grid or catwalk				
system have been properly trained in				
fall protection and working from				
heights.				
Counterweights for the tension grid				
are properly stacked and stored in				
designated locations and out of				
walkways.				
Tension grids and catwalks are free of				
other stored items.
